

Innovations in Healthcare: The Future of Medicine and Health Sciences



Olivia Jones, Assay Development Scientist, Osler Diagnostics and PhD Student, Oxford University

Olivia graduated from Bangor University in 2019 with a 1st class degree in Medical Sciences and the award for "best student". Since then, she has progressed from lab technician to Scientist at Osler Diagnostics; a start up in point of care rapid blood assay development. In 2021, Osler Diagnostics offered the opportunity to commercially collaborate with academia through a fully funded Masters degree. Olivia applied and was subsequently admitted to the University of Oxford where she is working with Prof. Nicola Smart, and after 9 months, transferred from the Masters programme to the PhD programme.
