## Edinburgh, Scotland



**DESCRIPTION:** Edinburgh is the capital city of <u>Scotland</u> and the seat of the <u>Scottish Parliament</u>, it's a very old city and there is evidence of human habitation on <u>Castle Rock</u> from as early as 3,000 years ago. The Old Town and New Town districts of Edinburgh were listed as a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 1995. Edinburgh attracts over 1 million overseas visitors a year, making it the second most visited tourist destination in the United Kingdom. It would be impossible to list everything available in Edinburgh, but here are a few things we would recommend:

**Famous landmarks:** Edinburgh Castle, the <u>Palace of Holyroodhouse</u>, <u>St. Giles' Cathedral Princes Street Gardens</u>, <u>Royal Botanic Garden Edinburgh</u>, <u>Edinburgh Zoo</u> or see the views of the city by taking a climb to the top of the <u>Scott Monument</u>.

Museums/Galleries: Royal Museum of Scotland, the Museum of Edinburgh, the Museum of Childhood, National Gallery of Scotland, Camera Obscura And World Of Illusions, The Royal Yacht Britannia, Edinburgh the Scotch Whisky Experience, Rosslyn Chapel and for a good all round introduction why not try an open top bus tour of the city with Edinburgh Bus Tours

**Sport:** Edinburgh has two professional football clubs – Heart of Midlothian and Hibernian, while Scottish national rugby union team plays at Murrayfield Stadium.

**Entertainment and Night life:** Edinburgh has a large number of pubs, clubs and restaurants - why not try some traditional Scottish food, such as 'Haggis' or 'Neeps and Tatties'?

Annual Events: Edinburgh Fringe, the largest performing-arts festival in the world other events include Edinburgh International Film Festival the Edinburgh Jazz and Blues Festival, Edinburgh International Festival; the Edinburgh Military Tattoo, the Edinburgh International Book Festival, the Hogmanay street party, Dussehra Hindu Festival, there is also the Edinburgh International Science Festival and the Beltane Fire Festival.
