

15 months following the end of your course you will be contacted and asked to complete the Graduate Outcomes survey. This is the biggest UK annual social survey and captures the perspectives and current status of recent graduates.

Why should you complete the survey?

The survey aims to help current and future students gain an insight into potential career destinations and opportunities. Your valuable responses will also help us to evaluate our courses and the results also inform higher education policy. Your information is anonymised and will remain secure and confidential at all stages of the survey.

How will I do it?

You will be contacted via an email from **bangor@graduateoutcomes.ac.uk** to ask you to complete the survey, and this may then be followed up with a text or phone call.

It takes about 10 minutes to complete the survey online, or a little longer if you are contacted to complete it over the phone.
